This includes trees and shrubs therefore, best to choose a conifer that will not outgrow its space in the landscape, and will only need Hemlock Young trees may require pruning to maintain a central leader However, little pruning is necessary on mature trees

keep landscape establishment and maintenance costs to a minimum, strive for a simple design and choose plants that are cold hardy, drought tolerant, and require little, if any, pruning In central Florida, this includes trees such as winged elm, bald cypress, and crape myrtle; shrubs such as yaupon holly, walter's viburnum, and florida zamia;
